The University of Missouri Department of Veterinary Medicine and Surgery invites applications for faculty positions in radiology (tenure or teaching track - assistant, associate or full professor). Applications for part time positions are also welcome. The faculty member will join an energetic, collegial imaging and radiation oncology program in operation of our busy small/large animal diagnostic imaging service in a modern veterinary medical teaching hospital.

As mission-critical roles for the University, our Teaching Hospital, and our academic programs in the college, this opening hold appeal to those interested in a vibrant clinical caseload. Those with desires to teach with added flexibility to provide consulting services are encouraged to apply for consideration. Efforts will be made to accommodate candidate's specifications when deemed appropriate.

The section of imaging supports an active teaching program in a unique academic structure, which offers a variety of ways to interact with an engaging student population. Beginning with an undergraduate course in radiation biology, a professional didactic course in radiology, a basic clinical rotation in radiology, 4 clinical electives in different aspects of radiology and 3 post graduate level courses in specific imaging modalities for residents, this program stands out in its depth, breadth, and reach.

The description of this 1.0 FTE/12 month appointment will depend upon the qualifications of the successful applicant:

An individual in the tenure-track will be expected to develop a research focus that compliments research performed by other departmental, college, or university faculty. A tenure-track faculty member will also be expected to participate actively in clinical and teaching activities of the radiology section. Section or departmental service may also be a part of the position description.

An individual in a nontenure-track position will be expected to concentrate his/her activities in the areas of clinical service and teaching (professional, graduate and resident). Scholarly activity is also expected and may include collaborative research activities. Section or departmental administrative service may also be a part of the position description.

Qualifications

Candidates must have a DVM or equivalent degree; successful completion of a residency in veterinary diagnostic radiology; eligibility for specialty board certification (ACVR or ECVDI); and eligibility for professional licensure (faculty license or regular license) as a veterinarian in the State of Missouri.

Selection Criteria

Candidates will be assessed based upon educational and professional achievement. Research experience, communication skills, organizational skills, experience working effectively in diverse environments and letters of reference will all be considered in selection of a candidate. Potential for candidate to work within the framework of the diagnostic radiology service will be assessed. The Veterinary Medical Teaching Hospital

MU's Veterinary Medical Teaching Hospital is a state-of-the-art teaching and medical services facility for companion animals as well as livestock. Columbia, MO is an ideal location for such a teaching hospital. The population of central Missouri and reasonable proximity to St. Louis and Kansas City provide for a robust small animal emergency and referral caseload. Missouri is a strong agricultural state with large numbers of horses, cattle, hogs, and poultry.

The Veterinary Medical Teaching Hospital is home to state-of-the-art equipment that allows for cutting-edge imaging and diagnostic activities. Current imaging equipment consists of:

- 3 general diagnostic small animal digital x-ray systems
- Digital radiography and computed radiography systems for large animal imaging
- GE Logiq 9 and Logiq E ultrasound systems
- GE 9900 C-arm Fluoroscopy unit
- 64 slice Toshiba CT scanner-capable of scanning large animals
- 3.0T Toshiba Titan MRI system-capable of scanning large animals

- Equistand II scintigraphy system with SPECT option
- Phillips C-Pet Plus PET scanner
- All imaging is digital and images are stored on the Department PACs system. A full spectrum of computer equipment and IT support services are provided for support of the section.
- Siemens Oncor Sensation linear accelerator
- Digital radiography, CT, and radiation therapy equipment also available at a satellite facility in the Saint Louis metropolitan area
