

Teaching Track Faculty Position in Veterinary Anatomy

The Department of Biomedical Sciences, College of Veterinary Medicine, University of Missouri invites applications for an Assistant or Associate Professor of Veterinary Anatomy in the Non-Tenure, Teaching Track.

The successful candidate will provide essential lecture and laboratory instruction in veterinary microscopic anatomy, large and small animal gross anatomy, and neuroscience, as well as presenting lecture material in developmental anatomy. They will join an experienced and dedicated team of veterinary educators within the department. Applicants should have a D.V.M., Ph.D., or equivalent degree in a relevant field, and should be able to provide evidence of exceptional teaching ability. A successful candidate is expected to possess the ability to work effectively with individuals and groups with a variety of identities, cultures, backgrounds, and ideologies.
