# MONTHLY NAVLE PREP QUESTION


An 8-year-old spayed female Chihuahua dog is evaluated because of a six-month history of cough. The client reports that the dog's tongue occasionally turns blue during a coughing episode. Body condition score is 8/9. Heart rate is 150 beats/min and respiratory rate is 28 breaths/min.
